Dear Commissioner Peterman:

As Supervisor of the Second Supervisorial District in San Diego County, I am writing to express my opposition to San Diego Gas & Electric's (SDG&E) application to develop, own, and operate Electrical Vehicle (EV) charging stations across San Diego County. While I support electric vehicle charging stations, ratepayer dollars should not be used for this purpose.

The estimated \$103 million in ratepayer money can be better used elsewhere. If SDG&E wants to build 5,500 electric vehicle charging stations at 550 locations across San Diego County, then SDG&E should pay, not ratepayers.

Ratepayers in San Diego County are still on the hook for the \$3.3 billion settlement agreement relating to the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS) and are possibly facing another \$367 million or more because of SDG&E's mistakes during the 2007 wildfires. San Diego County ratepayers deserve a break from these exorbitant costs that continue to come through the pipeline. I strongly urge you to reject SDG&E's request for \$103 million in ratepayer money for EV charging stations.
